Sharing Knowledge


Our Peninsula Virginia Master Naturalist volunteer program provides water quality testing in local waterways in York, Poquoson, Newport News, and Hampton through a Department of Environmental Quality grant. The results help localities identify issues contributing to waterway pollution. Since 2014, we have grown to 26 locations and put in over 700 volunteer hours per year.

The water quality testing has had great impacts, one of which helped a locality identify a creek with pollution from an overloaded and failing pump station releasing raw sewage into a local waterway. The pump station is currently being replaced. Water quality testing also helped a locality identify failing city sewer pipes along a shoreline that were releasing raw sewage into a local waterway. Those pipes were identified and replaced.
