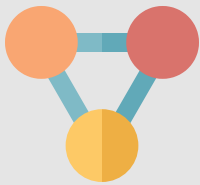

Volunteers conducted stewardship activities such as trail building, invasive plant management, and litter cleanups at **25 parks, natural areas, and other sites** in the community. They also created **1 new habitat site**.



Volunteers contributed to at least **62 natural resource inventory, monitoring, and research studies**, collecting data on pollinators, birds, invasive species, and more!



Volunteers made more than **19,000 direct contacts** through educational programs such as community nature walks, presentations, and training new VMN volunteers.
